

Shirley Ryan AbilityLab Inpatient Visitor Policy

Inpatients are allowed to have two visitors at a time 18 years or older, at a time (any exceptions must be approved by the nurse manager). If a visit is not essential, to protect the health of patients, we strongly encourage visitors to connect virtually or via phone instead of in-person. Our staff is prepared to assist patients in setting up video chats and phone calls.

Additionally, please note that:

- In certain situations, and based on health and safety considerations, all visitation may be restricted for some patients.
- Exceptions to the visitor policy may be made when multiple family members are directed by Shirley Ryan AbilityLab staff to come in for discharge planning and family teaching.
- All new patients will be tested for COVID-19 upon admission. More stringent visitor restrictions may apply to any patients who test positive.
- Visiting hours are from 8 am–8 pm; any exceptions, including overnight stays, must be approved by the nurse manager.
- Overnight visitors must provide proof of vaccination or a negative COVID PCR test (collected within 72 hours) to the nurse manager prior to their first stay. All overnight visitors must be 18+ years of age.
- Visitors coming from outside of the United States will either need to show proof of vaccination status, quarantine in Illinois for 14 days before visiting, or obtain a negative COVID PCR test on or after day seven of their arrival to visit sooner. Documentation should be provided to the nurse manager.
- Visitors must not come to Shirley Ryan AbilityLab if they feel ill or have been exposed to someone with known or suspected COVID-19.
- Visitors must check in on the 10th Floor Sky Lobby upon arrival, providing their names and showing identification. Then, they will undergo a health screening.
- While on inpatient units, visitors must stay in patients' rooms unless instructed otherwise, and avoid public spaces (e.g., Ability Labs, Innovation Center hallways, hubs, laundry rooms, vistas, etc.).
- Masking is required at all times (including when in patient rooms), regardless of vaccination status. Visitors may wear their personal N95 or KN95 masks (or their equivalents) or medical-grade surgical masks that we supply. In certain situations, and at the discretion of our staff, visitors who come with their own approved masks may still be required to wear hospital-provided masks. Those who do not adhere to our masking policy may be asked to leave.
- Gloves are not allowed to be worn by visitors, as they collect and transfer germs.
